**Survey Monkey Results:** Tina (Webmaster). Pam reports.

We received 73 responses but we can only access 40. Pam and Tina are trying to figure out how to obtain the remaining responses. Logan is arranging for specialists in 3 areas to review the "contents" of the preserve: birds, insects and plants. Specialists from CSU Extension Office, D51 will work with volunteers on walks to identify birds, insects, and plants on the preserve property. He has set up a page on INaturalist where the entries from the day will be recorded. He will provide instructions on how to enter findings. Advertising for the event will be on social media, webpage, and posters created by Logan. Logan will drop off posters at **Birds Unlimited**. **Chuck** will assist with putting up posters. **Nic** volunteered to lead a bird walk. **Pam** volunteered to do a table. **Logan** will continue to follow up with all participants to put this day together. Bird Walks: Pam (Program Chair)

Some volunteer walk leaders have had to cancel due to emergencies. Some leaders and participants requested walks be put on hold until the weather cools down. Nic suggested walks be held on the Grand Mesa.

**Pam** highly supports and will set up Bird Walks where there is no designated leaders but interested birders show up and share their expertise with each other. Other chapters have set these up and they are popular. It is a group effort bird walk. The board discussed setting up these walks on the same day ever week at same time and have a car pool location to meet. Grand Mesa could be the destination. **Pam** will review the options and advise the board.

Brett Walker will do bird walk next spring on Roan Plateau.

New Dimensions wants an additional set of people to participate in their bird programs. Photographers do not want to lead programs but they might be willing to join together on a joint walk with no leader or be part of a panel presentation at a regular Monday meeting.

**Preserve:** Chuck (Preserve Chair) Larry

Larry reported someone broke into the pump house and was sleeping in there. Larry reset the door temporarily. Larry obtained 2 quotes to have the door fixed at a cost of \$600. It does not appear anything significant was stolen. Chuck moved and Nic seconded a recommendation to have **Larry** hire a vendor at \$600 to repair the door.

Cary received bids and had some signs made to put up at the property. **Cary** will ask Dale to pay 50% of the cost of the signs. **Chuck** will figure out the best way to get the signs up. **Cary and Chuck** will meet on Tuesday.

Cary reported someone else is camping on the property and she advised Dale Reese to call the police dispatch. The county now has an ordinance where the county can remove someone on private property instead of requiring the owner to remove the person.

Chuck reported that he had hoped Yancey could be Mike's replacement, however, Yancey is ill and may not be readily available. **Cary** has someone in mind to be on the board and focus on the preserve.

Chuck Cary and Mike will water the trees at the preserve soon. Trees are doing great. Mike will give **Chuck** the volunteer list and Chuck will find out what other things Mike does at the preserve. **Chuck** has learned the pump and is pumpmaster. Water levels in the river are lowering and it is getting further and further out to physically get water. Having a wagon rather than a wheel barrel would make the job easier. Pam asked **Chuck** if he would like reimbursement for gas since he lives further away and will be at the property now that Mike is no longer available. Chuck advised thank-

# **Bird banding: Cary** (Banding Chair)

Mack mesa has fishing line tubes. **Nic** will speak with Evergreen person and see what they have implemented for this problem and follow through. Corn Lake is a big problem. **Nic** suggested Laura Johnston might be a good speaker for fishing line as part of a mini program.
